Parents,

Vision, Hearing, Acanthosis Nigricans & Spinal Screenings will be conducted on Oct. 26th & Oct. 27th. Children in Pre-k, Kindergarten, first, third and fifth grades will be screened for vision and hearing. If your child wears glasses or contacts, please be sure they have them on that day. In addition, all first, third and fifth graders will be screened for Acanthosis Nigricans (a marker for diabetes risk). Fifth graders will be screened for scoliosis. It is best if your child wear a T-shirt on screening day so I can clearly see their back bone structure.

Dear Parents,

Thursday morning, October 27, we will be practicing our first semester required emergency drills. Student safety is one of our main priorities at Owens Elementary. Our goal for performing the drills is to provide our students and staff with knowledge about possible emergency situations and to make sure they are familiar with the procedures in the event it is ever required.

On October 27 we will be practicing the following drills: an evacuation and reverse evacuation of the building, lock-down with an intruder inside/outside the building, shelter in place/weather related drill, a lock-down with hazardous materials as well as our monthly fire drill. Each teacher will be prepared in advance for the drills and will spend time talking with our students to let them know that all of the drills are being done to practice in case of an emergency. We will assure them that there is no real emergency happening.

Thank you for assisting us by talking to your child about emergency situations both at home and school and the need to practice and be prepared. Please let us know if you have any questions.

HORIZONS Mid-year Testing/Students K-11

Open Referral Period

October 3, 2016 through December 1, 2016

Parents/guardians who wish to refer their child for HORIZONS testing must follow the process described below:




- Please access the parent information within the HORIZONS website at <http://www.cfid.net/en/parents-students/academics/gifted-talented/> to review the PowerPoint presentation entitled, **Should I Refer My Child for the HORIZONS Program?**
- If testing is appropriate, request a **HORIZONS Parent Survey and Permission to Test** form no later than **Thursday, December 1, 2016**. Students will not be screened unless the parent permission form is returned by the **December 1** deadline.
- Kindergarten students will be tested on their campuses during the school day in January 2017, and students 1-11 will be tested on their campuses during the school day prior to Spring Break. Specific testing dates will be provided to parents by the campuses.
- Kindergarten students who qualify for HORIZONS will be receive services beginning in March 2017 with parent permission.
- Students in grades 1-11 who qualify for HORIZONS will receive services at the beginning of the 2017-18 school year. With parent permission.
